"1967-68 CAGE SEASON A BIG?"

On Friday, November 17, third year coach Don Barnbrook and his Eagles will host the St. Joseph Indians. Last year, the Eagles defeated the Indians, 88-22. Tip-off time is at 8:00 P.M. and the Eagles will be there.

Two Returning Lettermen

Only two lettermen return from last year's sectional winners, John Williams, a senior guard who scored 166 points and shot a respectable 67% from the charity stripe, and Richard Davis, Davis, the only sophomore to see action in the regional, scored 156 points.

Coach Barnbrook was hard hit by graduation last year, losing six seniors. But to make up for this, Coach Barnbrook will depend upon juniors to take up the loss. The juniors when they were freshmen had a 19-2 record.

Team Effort

Coach Barnbrook says that "the success of the overall picture depends upon the ability of the team to play together." In other words, there must be team effort. "We lost a tremendous amount of height, but with our quickness and our determination, we will be in contention."

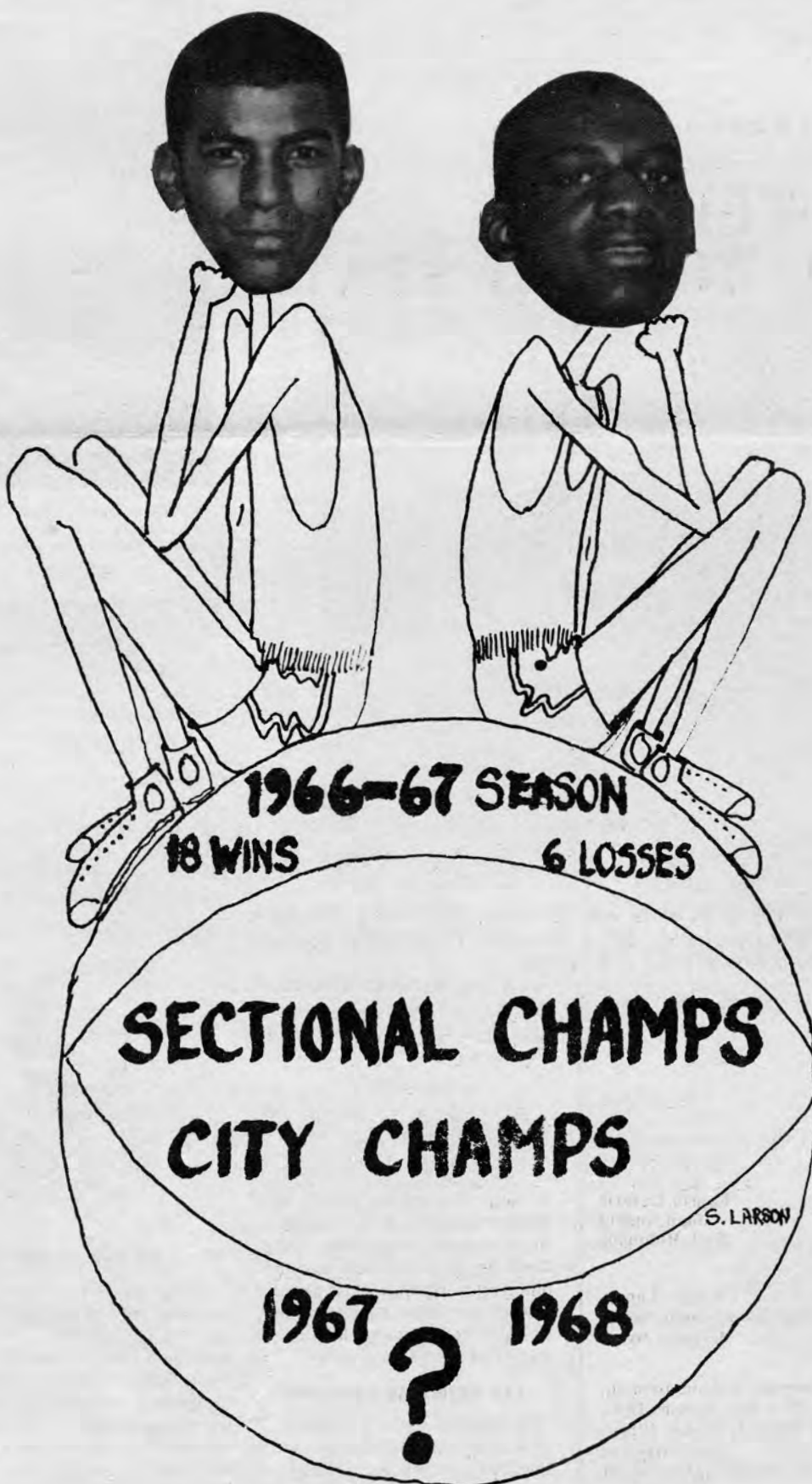
Same Type of Offense

Barnbrook hopes to use the same type of offense as last year, only modified somewhat. The type of offense is called the "A" with one guard and four forwards, as in an A-formation. This offense worked very well, as was evident in last year's regional game with Michigan City.

Davis will probably be center and then move to a forward after the tip-off. A senior, non-letterman, Terry Schaper, will most likely fill another forward position. He stands at 6-2. Seniors Mike Downey, Mark Beaudway, and Craig Scheu are vying for the other forward slots. Stan "Cotton" Neal, another senior, will be back-up man for Williams.

Greg Roberts, Rick Sayers, and Kelley Brownell are also making a strong bid for varsity action.

Coach Barnbrook has not cut the team down yet, due to the fact that the football players began practicing only the past week. As in past years, Barnbrook will carry a squad of at least 12 men and he must cut this list down to 10 players by sectional time. This seems to be a hard task, since there is such good talent present.



Tough Schedule

When asked about the schedule, Coach Barnbrook feels that all of the surrounding teams will be tough to beat. The Eagles show only one new team on the schedule this year, LaSalle. The game will be played February 10 at LaSalle. They replace the Gary Lew Wallace team.

The Eagles will play two conference foes before the Holiday Tournament. In the second half of the '67-'68 campaign, the Eagles face six conference teams plus an always tough Gary Roosevelt five. They also face Washington on February 2, and they will try to get revenge on this season's football loss.

Year of Change

To sum it up, Coach Barnbrook said that "looking over the picture for the next several years, we feel we have some real good players coming up." The Eagles might surprise many people in this area as he described this year as "the year of the change."

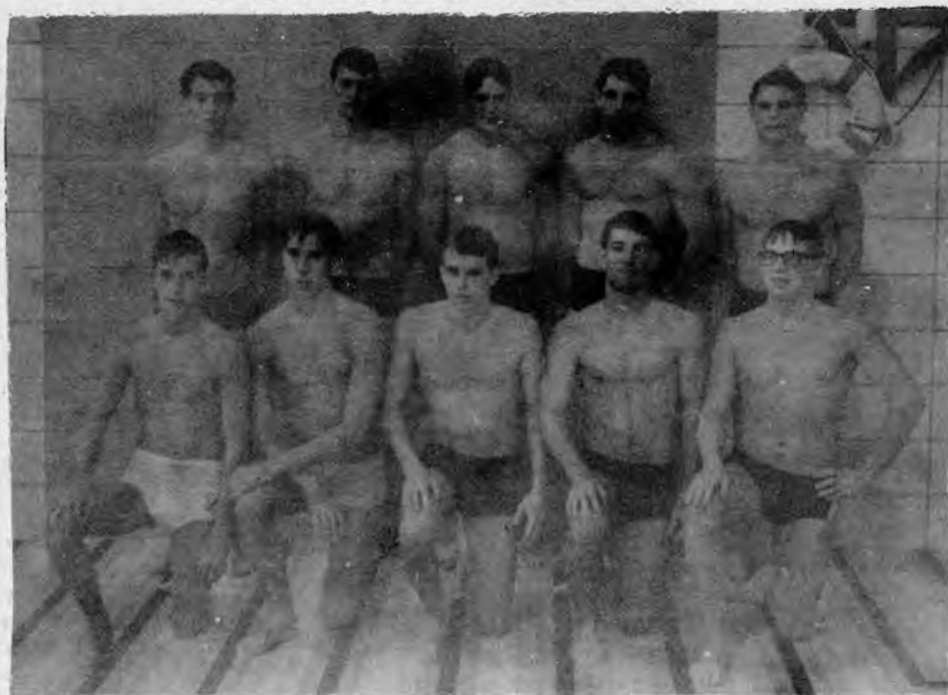
