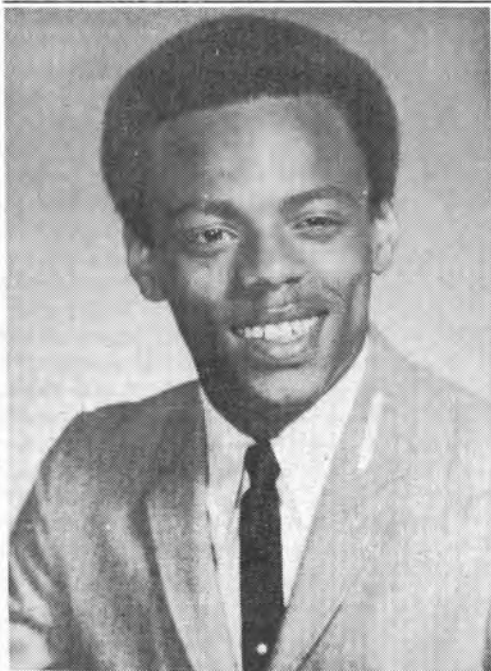

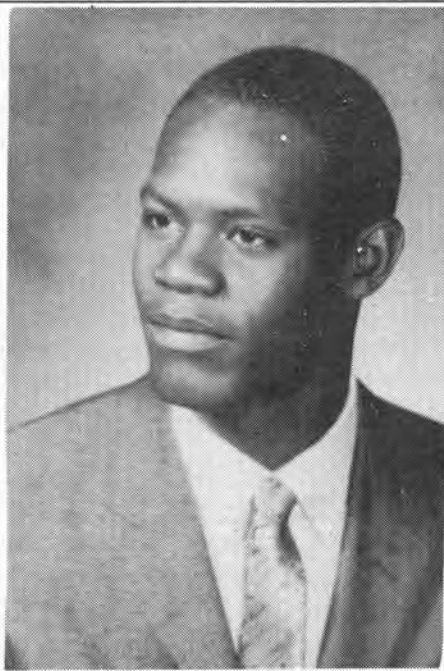

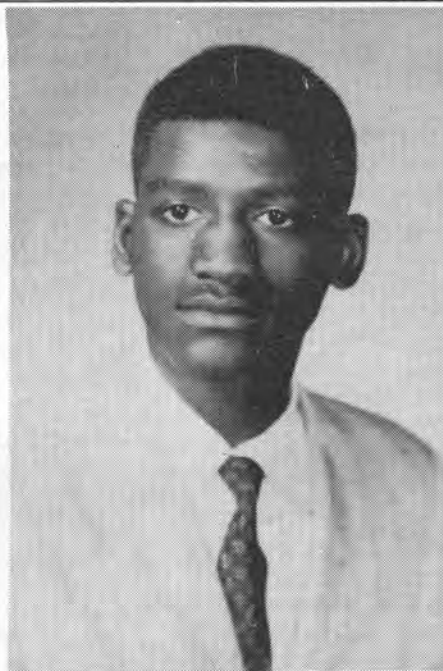

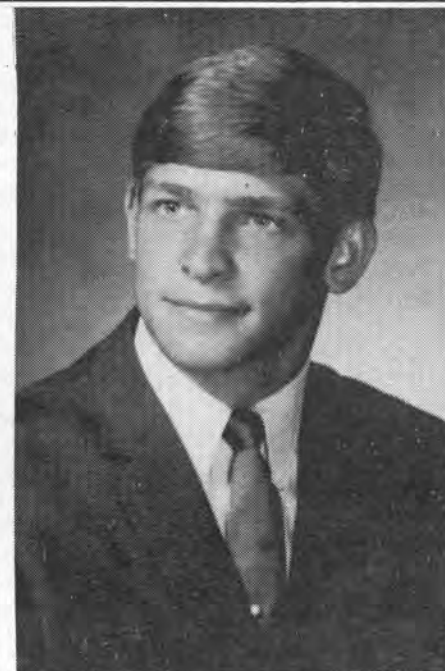

Eagles Face Sectional Champs, St. Joe, Tonight

After tonight we will know how great the Basketball Eagles of 1968-69 are. For tonight the Eagles face a very stern test at St. Joseph against the defending Sectional Champions. St. Joseph has lost two from last year's team but has Paul Fredlake and Mike Denning, who is a questionable starter tonight's game, back.

Four Letterman

Coach Don Barnbrook has a nucleus of four returning lettermen; center Richard Davis, guard Greg Roberts, Rick Sayers who will play either guard or forward, and Alonzo Warnell who will play either forward or pivot. Others on the roster are Timm Barnbrook, a forward, Matt Busch a guard, forward Tom Ehlers, forward and center Karl Hardy, guard Tim Madison, pivot and forward Mike Newbold, guard Jim Szucs, forward Scott Young, forward Ed Freel, and forward and pivot Lamar Jones. As of press time Barnbrook was uncertain as to who would start in tonight's game. "Anyone of the six seniors (Busch, Davis, Newbold, Roberts, Sayers, and Warnell) could start as well as a couple of underclassmen" said Barnbrook.

Good Speed

Offensive the Eagles will have a pattern offense and hope to utilize their speed. "I hope we will be able to use the fast break, but whether we can or not depends primarily on our rebounding strength."

If the Eagles have one strong point this year it is depth. They have six men over six feet, a fact the opposition will not like, needless to say. In addition to the height they also have some quick guards.

Unity Important

Barnbrook sees team unity as the key factor in the upcoming season.

"We could be successful if the boys make up their minds to play as a unit instead of individual or super stars" says Barnbrook. "Team play is necessary but unity is most important".

This year's Northern Indiana Conference race should be extremely close. Central once again should be very strong. Outside the South Bend area Michigan City and Goshen will probably be strong contenders for the Conference Title. There does not appear to be any one strong team. Nor does there appear to be any team considerably weaker than the rest of the league.

The success of this team is very uncertain. They have practically the entire starting line up from last year returning for the '68-69 season, but it is hard to tell what that can mean. A team can have a lineup of men with three years experience but if the players are not good enough, experience is not enough. The Eagles appear to have skilled players. The whole season will boil down to one big question mark-unity.

Seagles Shoot For Fourth Straight State Title

In 1966 they were confident. In 1967 they were uncertain. In 1968 they are doubtful. I am speaking of the Adams' Swimmers, who have won more trophies than any other Adams team and this year face their most serious to the State Crown they have occupied the last three years.

Chances Smaller

This may be the toughest year the Seagles have had under Coach Don Coar. The entire student body whether or not they know a thing about the team, assume the Seagles will take the State Title hands down. The truth is the Seagles will have to overcome a number of obstacles to take the title.

Coar rates the teams chances as "minute". Our chances are smaller than they "were last year" says Coar. "We have weaker team depth, graduated eight boys, and are missing about five boys in the school who did not even come out". It will take a tremendous amount of hard work to win it. You can rest assured that they will get plenty of hard work. The Seagles undoubtedly go through the roughest practice of the ten varsity sports. They practice in the morning and after school doing nothing but constant swimming.

The Seagles currently own a 64 dual meet winning streak. This provides the opposition with even more motivation.

Jackson Toughest Opponent

The entire team is pointing towards the meet of the year against Jackson on January 16. The Tigers are the team to beat in the area and will be the toughest team we will face during the year.

The Seagles open their season tomorrow with their own Adams Relays. The Seagles lost this meet last year because were limited to

two events per man while the other teams were allowed three events per man. This year there will be no restrictions.

Strong in Freestyle

The Seagles' strong event this year will be the freestyle especially the 200 and 400 yard events, where Bill Fitzgerald could be a contender for the state championship. Other freestylers are Tom Schrager and Jeff Clark who were members of last year's free relay team that was second in the state, returning letterman Dave Feldman and senior George Keely. Returning letterman Scott Wise will be aided by Doug Pichard, Ralph Zablocki, and Pat Hickey in the breast stroke. Jeff Clark, Scott Wise, and Dave Feldman will swim individual medley.

The butterflyers will be Jim Peltz and John Ford, and Denny Daniels will swim backstroke. In diving veterans Jeff Lichtenfelds and Rick Allen return as well as sophomore understudies Chuck Petterson and Steve Anderson.

Favored in Conference

Probably the only certain thing about this season is that Adams will win the Conference Meet. Although Riley will provide the toughest competition. The most uncertain part of the season is the State Meet and who will win the title. When it is all over look for the following teams to be the top competitors for the Seagles' State Crown; Kokomo, Columbus, Lawrence Central, Southport and South Bend Jackson. The Seagles chances, although they look bleak now, should improve with a lot of hard work.
